GUIDE to ADDRESS AFFIRMATION on ELECTION DAY

This form is designed to assist voters whom have moved prior to Election Day but have not yet changed their home address with their local Canvassing Office. Below you will find detailed information regarding the proper polling place you should be voting at according to federal law, depending on when and where you moved prior to the election.

If You Moved Within The Same City/Town	And You Moved:	You Are Eligible To Vote At:
If you moved within the same voting district	At any time	Same polling place
If you moved from one voting district to another within the same City/Town	30 days or MORE prior to the election	Polling place of your NEW address or Board of Canvassers
If you moved from one voting district to another within the same City/Town	LESS than 30 days prior to the election	Polling place of your PREVIOUS address or Board of Canvassers
If You Moved From One City/Town In Rhode Island to Another City/Town In Rhode Island	And You Moved:	You Are Eligible To Vote At:
If you DID NOT register to vote from your NEW residence more than 30 days prior to the election	LESS than 6 months, but more than 30 days prior to the election,	Board of Canvassers of your FORMER City/Town
If you DID NOT register to vote from your NEW residence more than 30 days prior to the election	LESS than 30 days	Polling place of your OLD address in your previous city/town of registration
If You Moved Into Rhode Island or to Another State:		

- ♦ If you moved into Rhode Island from out-of-state, you must register to vote in Rhode Island at least <u>30 days</u> prior to an Election or Primary, or you are INELIGIBLE to vote in Rhode Island. Except in Presidential elections when a voter may go to his/her Board of Canvassers and register to vote on Election Day and vote <u>ONLY</u> for President/Vice-President <u>AT</u> THE BOARD OF CANVASSERS.
- ♦ If you moved from Rhode Island to another state, you are INELIGIBLE to vote in Rhode Island.
